Dear Prize Applicant:

Below is the application for both the **AATF Tom Betts Senior Prize** and the **Alliance Française of Northwestern CT Senior Prize**. Please read all directions carefully with your teacher. The Prize committee will consider only those applications which use this year's form and which are accurate and complete.

This year, the AATF-CT will offer the AATF-CT Tom Betts Senior Prize in the amount of \$1000 to one senior. Each teacher who is a member of AATF-CT may nominate one senior currently studying French, who does not come from a home where French is the spoken language or who has not lived or studied in a French-speaking country for more than eight weeks.

Teachers wishing to nominate a senior for the AFNWCT Senior Prize (\$500) must also be members of the AATF-CT and must teach in Litchfield County or the towns of Bethel, Brookfield, Danbury, Middlebury, Monroe, Naugatuck, New Fairfield, Newtown, Oxford, Sherman, Southbury, or Waterbury. - 1. Print and complete the application on the following pages in black ink. You will scan these as a PDF and email them to us.
- 2. Include a one-page letter of recommendation from the French teacher who is nominating you. This letter may be in French or in English.
- 3. Include a scan of one of your essays done as a class assignment that has been graded.
- 4. Include a scan of an unofficial (student) copy of your high school transcript as well as your standardized test scores (SAT I and SAT II Subject Tests, ACT, AP, etc).
